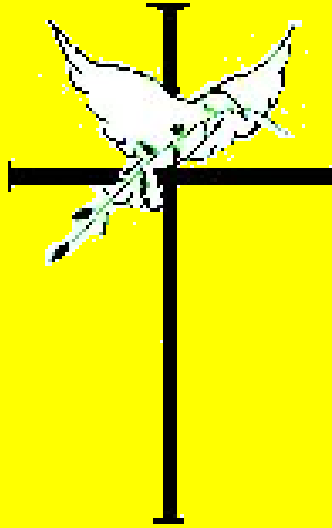

Dear Friends

During the last few weeks we have been reminded on two occasions that we must prepare for coming events. First of all Mpume said that we should prepare ourselves for the Church meeting when we had to seek God's will regarding the calling of Revd Ron Davis to the pastorate at The Green. Then Howard told us that after calling Ron, we should be prepared to work alongside him, and not expect him to do all the work. We are a team, and as in all teams, whether in sport, club, or society, we each have a part to play. We must all pull our weight and support the leader of the team.

It is not always usual to call to the pastorate of a church the first person we hear, but it became clear to us that this was the will of God. Ron tells me that both he and Sandra felt that God was working with them and us in this process, and we look forward to Ron's induction on the 21st January 2012.

When we talk of being prepared, I can't help but think of the Scout's motto - 'Be Prepared'. (Officers of the Brigade, please excuse this). But we must be ready to give Ron all the support we can. He will need a period of time to get to know us and all our habits and traditions. Some of these he may wish to change. It is well known that we Baptists 'don't do change', but we may have to consider some changes.

Plans are being put in place ready for the Induction service and you may be asked to help in some way. Please help if you are asked. John the Baptist prepared the way for the coming of Jesus, and our job will be to prepare the way for Ron and Sandra's arrival.

I make no apology for referring again to prayer. I seem to have mentioned this more than once recently. But it is an integral part of our faith and our worship. Between now and the 21st January 2012 we need to pray for Ron and Sandra in two aspects. First of all as they leave the fellowship at Earl Shilton in Leicestershire. They are going to be without a Pastor there for some time and it will be difficult for Ron and Sandra to leave in many ways. Then we should pray for them as they prepare to come to us. We must pray for ourselves as we embark on a new period in the life of our Church. We must ask for God's blessing upon us. We must pray that Ron's ministry may be one of looking forward, of outreach, and mission.

The last 12 months or so have not always been easy for us as a fellowship and a lot of extra responsibility has fallen on a number of people. For strength to do this we give God thanks. With Ron's calling it

seems as if much of the burden has been lifted. At a recent Deacons meeting, Charles reminded us that Jesus lifts the burden from us and takes it upon himself. Without that burden we can look forward to a brighter future under Ron' s leadership. I am reminded of an old hymn which has a verse that says:-

Not a burden we bear
Not a sorrow we share
But our toil he will richly repay;
Not a grief nor a loss
Not a frown nor a cross
But is blest if we trust and obey.

So lets trust and obey and may we all be united in supporting Ron's ministry and know that, by prayer, we can do great things for God and His kingdom.

Church Cleaning Proposals – Cliff Homer

For those members not present when I presented the proposals for Church Cleaning on 19th June, and to amplify one or two points, I would like to present, for the benefit of all, the ideas as noted. Also due to being a brief summary (be brief and don't take over the Service, I was instructed!) a couple of points were omitted.

Firstly, I accept that whatever is tried may need amending as we go along, but the idea is a starting point. You may recall that when Mary 'retired' last year we produced a 'job specification' to set out for whoever should follow, as a guide for what was required for all areas of the Church. This would be equally valid for an individual from within or outside of the fellowship, or for an outside company.

As written, the specification was generally on a room to room basis on the assumption that was the way Mary had perfected the job over many years.

Following the June Church meeting I suggested the scheme as presently proposed, by using 'Task Cards' for guidance of those wishing to partake. It became obvious that if 'volunteers' do the work, then a simplified arrangement would be preferable whereby each 'task' might be only part of, say, one room.

By rearranging ideas some 22 tasks were considered; however, don't be put off from volunteering as many items will be short in duration and effort, but is still necessary for the full hygiene and upkeep of our buildings. Also, by splitting up the work, several jobs from different areas are combined, so, if you like to 'Brasso', you will find all three areas are on one card!

Each 'task card' shows the area of the building, its required work, and also the frequency of the task, eg:- "No 8 Area: Rear Corridor Wet-mop when needed". By making more but much smaller tasks it is hoped the as many members as possible will feel able to offer their services in some small way. Remember, not all areas will be in need of work every week; take a look at a card and see what is needed and if you have the time to help keep your Church tidy.

The 'task cards' will be kept in two clear boxes on the serving hatch, foyer side.

When a job is completed, put the card in the basket and record the fact in the book for that purpose. This is to avoid repeating jobs at the expense of overlooking others.

One item that I didn't mention during my brief talk was the idea that all persons using any area for a function or meeting should check the area on leaving, so that it is left in a state as it was (hopefully) found. We are NOT asking you to vacuum, wash, polish all surfaces, just avoid any mess for the next user!

If you have suggestions for improvements, please let either myself or Andy Yearwood know.

Talking drugs

How a Baptist youth minister recently spent his two weeks in Lebanon

When BMS worker Arthur Brown was looking for someone to help him train youth workers and teach young people in Lebanon about the issue of substance misuse, he turned to one of his link churches in the UK.

In May, Martin Hills, Youth Minister at Central Baptist Church, Chelmsford, travelled to Beirut to stay with Arthur, his wife Louise and their children for two weeks.

Martin used his background in young people's drugs education to provide a number of training opportunities at churches, schools, an orphanage and within one of the city's poorest areas.

Here are some edited extracts from Martin's blog (www.centralbaptistchelmsford.org/blog) which give you a flavour of his experience.

Day 1

Beirut is a city on the go. There are places of extreme poverty and places of extreme wealth, sometimes side by side. Beirut is still rebuilding from the civil war that ended in 1990 – everywhere you look there are cranes and workmen.

This evening Arthur and I met with a team from a local Catholic church that is working with recovering addicts to see if there is anything we can do together whilst I am here.

Day 3

The training tonight at the boys' orphanage was fantastic. Really enjoyed the session, though need to refine the programme. The boys were fantastic and really joined in.

Day 4

This morning I joined in a lecture at Arab Baptist Theological Seminary about discipleship in a postmodern context. It was interesting to hear from students the issues they face in Middle East/North Africa in terms of engaging with young adults. This afternoon I gave my first

school lesson (50-minute interactive) to around 60 students aged about 15. What a buzz! The students were great.

Day 5

I attended a follow-up conference for growing leaders and presented a two-hour workshop about drug awareness. It was great to share experiences and knowledge with other youth workers.

Day 7

Today I have experienced some of the most moving scenes in my life to date. I visited the Tahaddi project – working in a refugee camp (one of the poorest in Beirut), providing schooling and healthcare.

I spent an hour teaching these young people about the dangers of drugs for them, their friends and their families. For many of them, drugs are a reality. They know people that use, particularly solvents but also heroin. They belong to a community that has to fight (sometimes literally) for the basics that we take for granted.

Tahaddi is trying to bring hope, providing education to young people who have been forgotten. My session felt almost irrelevant in the context of their lives, but I hope they will remember something of what I have taught and maybe, just maybe, their

lives will be a little bit safer.

Day 8

Today I spoke at a school chapel. I was asked to speak generally about addiction and I thought about the things in life that can take over our lives and damage our relationship with God... money, fame, phones, internet, power, etc. I finished with Matthew 6: 24... “you cannot serve both God and money”.

Day 11

Today we visited Tyre to give a drugs seminar in a Palestinian refugee camp (entry by invite only, and escorted), which was a really good experience and a great way to end my work.

On the way back up the coast we stopped at Sidon for a drink. We left at about 4.15pm and, when we got home, we discovered that a UN convoy had been bombed in Sidon after we had left. How fragile peace is in this country!

Day 12

Well, I am home safe and sound and now need to process my thoughts so that I can give an update to the church. Social action, cultural relevance and community engagement are some of the themes that are bouncing around in my head.

Well, after months of preparation with willing hands and God's blessings, the belief that was held by a few members became a reality when the Stafford Baptist Church Christian Book Shop opened its doors for business on Saturday 10th September 2011 at 10 am.



The Grand Opening was well attended by a good cross section of the community. There were customers who had seen the flyers/newspaper articles and had visited out of curiosity while many had been informed via mail shots and personal visits to the various Churches across Stafford. The official opening ceremony was performed by our local MP Mr Jeremy Lefroy who expressed an interest in the conception of the Bookshop and requested a list of all the volunteers who would be working in the shop.

Sales on the opening day were very encouraging and orders were received for specific literature such as bible study notes, prayer guides, and devotions. If customers require a particular book/item we are able to contact our suppliers, the Methodist Book Centre in Hanley who will endeavour to obtain it with minimum delay. In addition to Christian literature we also aim to stock a selection of gifts, cards, CDs/DVDs and audio products. There is a stand displaying 'Cards by Penny J' where cards can be made to order for any occasion and every month we will be featuring special offers on certain books, so it is well worth popping in to see what we have on the shelves.

For those of you who have or know of children, grandchildren between the ages of 3 – 12 years, the colouring competition that was launched on opening day is still running and will close on 30th September, so there is still time for further entries. There are 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizes for age groups 3-5, 5-9, and 9-12. Mr Lefroy has kindly accepted the task of judging the entries submitted.

We are truly thankful to God for this wonderful opportunity of mission outreach and would also like to take this opportunity to convey our heartfelt gratitude to the members of our congregation who have supported this venture with their generous offers of help and assistance throughout the setting up of the facilities. A very special thank you also to everyone who have willingly volunteered their time to work in the Book Shop over the coming months. May God bless you all!
